The overwhelming majority (upwards of 84%!) of STEM Program and Biotech Program graduates are pursuing STEM degrees at four-year colleges, including Caltech, Columbia, Dartmouth, Virginia Tech, Harvey Mudd and nearly every UC and CSU in the state.
